Renewed like the eagle

The Bible compares the rest and renewal of a believer to the soaring of an eagle. An eagle rests in flight.

Prov. 30:19a [ESV]. the way of an eagle in the sky. . . .

Ps. 103:5 [ESV]. who satisfies you with good so that your youth is renewed like the eagle's.

An eagle can soar high enough for ice to form on its wings.

An eagle has been seen by pilots at 25,000 feet.

An eagle can fly at 100 miles per hour.

The Bible compares the power and redemption of the Lord to the flight of the eagle.

Ex. 19:4 [ESV]. You yourselves have seen what I did to the Egyptians, and how I bore you on eagles' wings and brought you to myself.

The adult eagles stir up the nest when it is time for the young eagles to fly. It becomes time to trust and rely on the power under the wings.

Dt. 32:11-12 [ESV]. Like an eagle that stirs up its nest, that flutters over its young, spreading out its wings, catching them, bearing them on its pinions, the LORD alone guided him, no foreign god was with him.

Renewal comes as believers trust the Lord for the strength and power to do His work. Confidence is in Him alone for strength.

Is. 40:31 [ESV]. but they who wait for the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles; they shall run and not be weary; they shall walk and not faint.
